Thomas Fortune Fay, Rutgers Law School '65, is a pioneer advocate representing American victims of foreign state-sponsored terrorism. His cases included representation of the victims of the Beirut Marine barracks bombing of 1983, the bombings of the American embassies in Tanzania and Kenya in 1998, and the 1995 suicide attack in Gaza that killed Elisa Flatow. He investigated these cases abroad, drafted legislation enacted by the U.S. Congress, tried these cases, handled appeals and strategized the representation of these and other victims of suicide bombing sponsored by the governments of Iran and Sudan, recovering billions of dollars in foreign assets for their benefit.
